Closure of Sangster International Airport due to Hurricane Beryl

Montego Bay, Jamaica – July 2, 2024 12:25 P.M.

In light of the impending threat posed by Hurricane Beryl, Sangster International Airport will temporarily close tonight, Tuesday, July 2, at 11:59 PM. The airport will remain closed throughout Wednesday, July 3, to ensure safety during the hurricane's passage.

Following the hurricane, a comprehensive assessment will be conducted to determine when it is safe to resume operations. Updates will be communicated promptly.

Passengers are urged to contact their airlines directly for flight rescheduling information, and confirmation of flight status before traveling to the airport.

The safety and well-being of our passengers and staff remain our utmost priority and all necessary precautions are being taken to ensure a swift and safe resumption of operations once the hurricane has passed.
