

1. AVELO HAS GONE INTERNATIONAL

DECADES OF **BREAKTHROUGHS BRING HOPE**

One in eight women get breast cancer. Today, I'm the one. The good news is that I have the most glorious group of supportive and caring friends, and fantastic insurance through my union. The bad news is that not all women are so lucky, so let's fight all cancers and make universal health care a reality

ver the past several decades, new hope and options to patients around the world. Each development, from chemotherapy to genetic profiling, has contributed to a more personalized, effective approach to care.

Chemotherapy became central to breast cancer treatment in the 1970s, effectively targeting fast-growing cancer cells, though it also impacted healthy cells, often causing side effects. Key drugs like Adriamycin set the stage for later advances like Taxol (1994) and Xeloda (1998), which remain essential in treatment.

At the same time, hormonal therapies like tamoxifen showed promise for hormone-sensitive cancers. In 1996, Arimidex, an aromatase inhibitor, was introduced, effectively blocking estrogen in postmenopausal women with estrogen receptor-positive cancers.

Surgical methods improved with lumpectomy in the 1980s, a breast-

conserving option that removed only cancerous tissue. Often combined with breast cancer treatment has seen chemotherapy and radiation, lumpectomy significant advancements, offering became a less invasive alternative with similar survival rates to full mastectomy.

> The 1990s brought biologics and targeted approach to genetic risk. therapies that focused on cancer cells, sparing healthy ones. Herceptin, approved These advancements—spanning in 1998 for HER2-positive cancer, became chemotherapy, hormonal therapy, a landmark, followed by Kadcyla in 2013. Today, targeted therapies like Pigray and PARP inhibitors such as Lynparza offer vital options, especially for BRCA-positive cases.

Genetic profiling now allows doctors to personalize treatment by analyzing cancer's genetic makeup, helping them predict recurrence and choose therapies suited to each cancer subtype.

Identifying high-risk groups has also refined care by highlighting disparities. Black women, for instance, face higher mortality rates, while Asian American breast cancer rates have risen. This insight has led to targeted screening and prevention strategies.

Understanding family history and genetics is also essential in assessing risk. While a family history of breast cancer increases likelihood, only 10% of cases are tied to genetics, underscoring the need for a balanced

surgical techniques, biologics, genetic profiling, and risk identification continue to shape a promising future for breast cancer treatment. Together, they represent a comprehensive and evolving strategy that improves survival rates and empowers patients with more effective, individualized

Each breakthrough in breast cancer treatment brings us closer to personalized care and improved survival transforming hope into reality for millions.

MEN'S **HEALTH**

September is National Prostate Cancer Awareness Month, bringing crucial focus to prostate cancer, a leading health threat to Jamaican men. In Jamaica, prostate cancer is the most common cancer, responsible for the highest number of cancer-related deaths among men. According to the Jamaica Cancer Registry, between 1998 and 2002, over 870 new cases were reported in Kingston and St. Andrew alone, underscoring the urgency of awareness.

Regular screening, particularly for high-risk individuals, is essential to catching prostate cancer early. Despite some debate around screening relevance, for high-risk groups like those of African descent or with a family history, early detection remains key to reducing mortality and combating the disease's impact on Jamaican men.

The Jamaica Cancer Society (JCS) currently has the largest and most-organised screening clinic for prostate cancer in Jamaica. The JCS is a non-profit, non-governmental organisation that was formed in 1955 to initiate and engage in activities for the prevention and control of cancer in Jamaica.

While prostate cancer is relatively common, doctors can detect most cases early and provide effective treatment. The best way to detect prostate cancer in its early stages is to attend regular screening. Depending on risk factors, it may be advisable for people to begin screening at 40.

TERTIARY AWARDES

Three "Beyond Barriers Superstars" shared their compelling journeys, highlighting how the MBJ grants are helping them overcome significant obstacles. Anika Harty spoke of the challenges she faced as a first-generation university student from a household of six. These included losing her job during the pandemic and having to shift from full-time to part-time studies to help with family hills

Cheryl Thompson-Tingling, a 43-yearold street vendor pursuing a degree at Sam Sharpe Teachers College, demonstrated that education has no age limit. "I never got to attend school regularly as a child," Thompson-Tingling revealed, "but I still had this deep dream." Now a mother of three, she earned six CXC subjects while maintaining her business, proving that determination knows no bounds. "You don't have to give up because there is light at the end of the tunnel. I don't have a laptop. I use my phone," She shared as she encouraged her fellow recipients to never give up.

Natasha Pritchard, a finance and management student at Montego Bay Community College, shared how she paused her education for two years to support her family after both parents faced serious health challenges. "Watching your parents, your backbone and support system, in their most vulnerable state creates a constant fear," Pritchard shared. Despite these challenges, she resumed her studies and is now in her fourth and final year with the support of the MBJ grant.

MBJ INCLUSIVITY AWARDEES

With EU support, St. James High School is introducing A.R.R.O.W. (Aural Read Respond Oral Write), a proven software that enhances literacy by allowing students to work independently at their own pace. Through the Literacy Education Acceleration Project (LEAP) and other partners, the school has access to this software.

To aid the school in their mission to lessen literacy gap, they have been awarded \$400,000 to assist in procuring additional computers for the students.

SPOT VALLEY HIGH O2HERBERT MORRISON **TECHNICAL HIGH**

With the support of Team Sangster, Herbert Morrison Technical High School is enhancing its Mechanical Technology program to better serve its students.

The school, which currently has over 70 students in the program, will use the \$300,000 grant to purchase much-needed welding machines, improving their ability to deliver 34 hands-on training.

Supported by this \$300,000 grant, the renovation will introduce spaces for netball, basketball, volleyball, football, cricket, and other field events, enriching the school's athletic facilities.

This renovation represents a significant step forward in fostering an environment where students can thrive both academically and physically.

MONTEGO BAY AUTISM CENTER

In 2010, Mrs. Ada Ma Blagrove established the Montego Bay Autism Center (MBAC) to support autistic children and teens in Western Jamaica. Recently, the center was awarded \$400,000 for a painting project to improve health and safety. This includes applying sealant flex paint to classroom ceilings to prevent dampness and chipping, as well as painting the three buildings to address mold and mildew. These improvements ensure compliance with regulations and align with MBAC's commitment to providing a safe environment for students and staff.

HAMPTON HIGH

Hampton High School's Calder Hall, the sole Assembly Hall on campus, was severely damaged during Hurricane Beryl. To help restore the facility, the school has been awarded \$400,000 to replace the damaged windows.

This funding will support the necessary repairs, ensuring that the Calder Hall can once again serve as a safe and functional space for school events, assemblies, and activities. The renovation is an important step in maintaining the school's infrastructure and providing students with a conducive learning environment.

WINGZ KIDS

Founded on October 25, 2022, and granted charity status in July 2023, delivers essential academic and social support to children in Montego Bay's inner-city communities. Since January 2023, we've registered over 50 students, offering Numeracy and Literacy programs along with Mentorship, Arts, and Sports services.

Assessment tools confirm what we see daily—many of our students are well below grade level. To aid in the expansion of their Literacy & Numeracy programs, which includes partnerships with Albion and Mt. Salem Primary Schools, they have been awarded \$400,000.





Dehydration happens when you lose more fluid than you drink. The most common cause of water loss, is excessive sweating.




